The Photographer's Desk

I have been Blau Rain editor since 2006, except for a few months while there was no Blau Rain. No longer a monthly printed or published newsletter, Blau Rain remains popular as a semi-annual publication. Join my journey through my tenure as editor.

Feb - Sept 2006 - Same

The first eight months as editor I used the cover design used on previous Blau Rains. October 2006 brought my first redesign of the cover. While black & white was still printed, some of the covers here are in their designed color.

Dec 2006 - Printed Color

The December 2006 issue was approved to have a color cover. I used my 1999 Boxster on the cover and designed what appears to be a video player to display it. Digital photography was not great then, but it was easier than film.

Jan 2007 - Jun 2009

Not much changed from January 2007 to December 2009. Digital photography improved, and my digital camera was upgraded. More people started using digital cameras so getting photographs for publication became easier.

Jul 2009 - Dec 2019

Beginning with the July 2009 issue the size of Blau Rain changed from half-page to magazine size. Along the way the number of issues was reduced from monthly to quarterly to semiannually. January issues are a recap of the previous year and are printed for distribution.

2020 - The Future

The current cover design started January 2020. The layout of the newsletter was also changed to create a more modern looking publication. Gone are even columns and perfectly spaced photographs. My current camera creates film quality photographs.







A 359 headlight grill, a pause for relief on pit lane at a DE, two wide in the wet does not work on tis turn, same turn but with a spin this time.






Cloud reflection on a shiny hood, fun at a DE, a Cayman R, and full course caution due to rain during a race at VIR.







A 911 being restored, a 356 restored, a line of 911s, and another 911 being restored as found.
